The expected learning outcomes participants should look forward to obtaining while participating in this workshop include instruction in core features of RTI: high quality classroom instruction, universal screening, continuous progress monitoring, and evidence based interventions for math fluency implemented with treatment integrity. Group discussion will revolve around the implementation of a response to intervention process by using curriculum-based measurement math probes for universal screening and/or the identification of specific skill deficits and aid in the determination of appropriate evidence based interventions to implement in small group settings. Several scenarios will be used to explain the process of using curriculum-based measurement to progress monitor students in math and determine effective interventions for building math fluency. The discussion will involve the importance of fluency in mastering basic math skills, evidence of math fluency, and specific interventions to use to build math fluency.

These techniques can help the adult manage situations in a more professional manner, can help the child's tantrums stop sooner and maybe be less severe, can teach the child cause and effect with consequences, and can help the adult and child feel better about the way situations are handled.
